
Speaking of donations, last year's funds went to the teen room and teen programming. This year, we plan to fund general library programming. And let's not forget, we received nearly \$10,000 from the Buck Education Fund of the Yolo Community Foundation, an affiliate of the Sacramento Region Community Foundation, for the library's Bilingual Storytime: Stay, Learn, and Play Program. The grant will allow the Arthur F. Turner branch to hold 100 Bilingual Storytime Programs (50 in Russian and 50 in Spanish).




The WSFOL Annual Dinner meeting is Thursday, October 10, 2019, at 6:00 p.m.

“Hungry” to Read? There’s Still Time...

March 2 – April 13, 2019

Children ages 4 – 12 are invited to read 5 books and receive a free In-N-Out coupon. Sign up at any Yolo County Library branch and get a reading log. After reading five books, turn in your log for an “Achievement Award” for a free cheeseburger/hamburger/grilled cheese sandwich/veggie sandwich. Participants may earn up to 3 coupons during this program. Children unable to read themselves may participate by having books read to them.
